



Accessible despite full closure

The A544 motorway has been closed since January 2024 for a total of 22 months from the exit (AS) Würselen during the replacement of the Haarbachtal bridge. Especially during rush hour and peak time, you should allow extra time for your travel. Detour routes will take you to Aachen via the A44 and A4.

On the A44, please use the exit Aachen-Brand or Aachen-Lichtenbusch and on the A4 take the Aachen-Zentrum or Aachen-Laurensberg exit.

Travelling by car

Route and traffic situation:

- App from the Autobahn GmbH with current information on the traffic situation

There are various park and ride facilities en route. Find out more before your journey.

Travelling by bus and train

Aachen is easy to reach by train. The central train station is served by the Eurostar and ICE express trains. The stations Aachen West and Aachen Schanz (close to the city centre) and the station Aachen Rothe Erde (in the east of the city) are also served by regional trains. Aachen can also be reached quickly by train from the Netherlands.

Once you have arrived at the station, the local public transport provider ASEAG will take you to your destination.

Check whether your event ticket already includes free use of local public transport. For both individual and group travellers, there are options for trips by local transport that may be of interest to you. Take a look.

Regardless of whether you are travelling for shopping, a concert or an event, plan for a longer journey and, if possible, use alternative travel options such as bus or train.

Inform yourself about the project, the detour routes, the current traffic situation and possible alternatives to driving by car.

Avoid driving by car by carpooling. Ride together with like-minded people. You can find passengers using passenger portals.

Postpone trips and avoid rush hours and peak time.

Change the transport mode and use possible alternatives, such as the bus, the train (also in connection with the use of park and ride facilities) or a bike forshort distances.
